CRITERIA:

The major criterion for the award is research excellence. When reviewing submissions, the CIESC/SCECI Award Committee for the Douglas Ray Award will pay special attention to the following:

- a) the significance of the problem addressed;
- b) the conceptualization and design of the research presented;
- c) the clarity of writing and organization of the paper; and
- d) the potential value of the research for theory development, improved practice and future research.

ELIGIBILITY: The candidate must have presented his or her paper as a graduate student at the CIESC/SCECI 2018 Annual Conference at the University of Regina. The student must submit a complete version of the paper to be adjudicated, up to 7,000 words not including the abstract and references.

AWARD FOR THE SELECTED RECIPIENT

- a) Certificate of Accomplishment presented at the CIESC/SCECI Reception at the CSSE Conference;
- b) Travel subsidy to attend the 2019 CSSE conference (Andrew Skinner Award); and
- c) One-year free membership in CIESC/SCECI.
